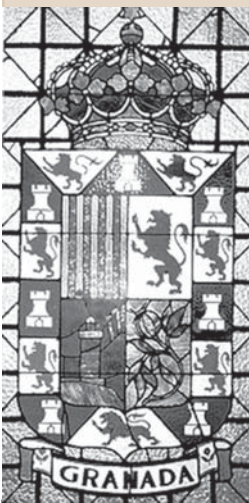

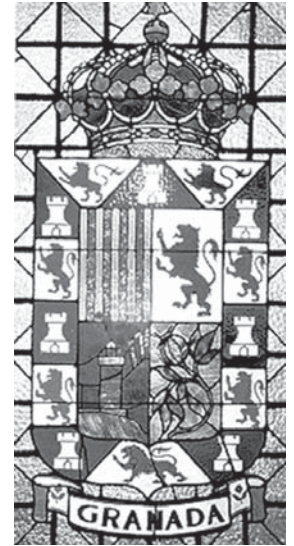
In the Name
