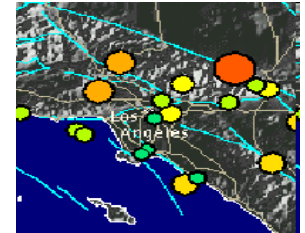


Earthquake Awareness

IN THE EVENT OF AN EARTHQUAKE DO

1. Get away from any glass or shelves
2. Shelter in place - in a doorway
3. Put shoes on - after shaking stops

DON'T

1. Don't panic

The Granada is the first reinforced steel building in San Francisco - built for earthquakes

2. Don't walk with bare feet - floor will be littered
3. Don't smoke or ignite any flame - gas DANGER
4. Don't use the telephone - EMS will need all lines
5. Don't use the elevators - even if they respond, they may have sustained damage - Use the stairs
6. Don't close any door - they could jam closed
7. Don't use the water - DO NOT flush toilet

If you are bed bound

Try not worry - we know you're there

The name of The Granada

It does not mean pomegranate, even though it is homonymous with the Spanish word for that oriental fruit and is pictured in The Granada crest, to the left.

The name comes from an ancient, but unknown word for **fortress** which the Romans Latinized as **Garnatum** (note fortress on the crest).

The Arabs pronounced it **Garnata** and it entered Castilian Spanish as **Granada**.
